

Dear ministry partners, October was another action packed month with all kinds of happenings. The first piece of news we would like to share is that we brought in a group of four siblings. We're glad to see these four adjusting well to life here with us as they're quickly making friends and already in school and just all around happy to be here. We continue to ask for your <u>prayers</u> for all of the kids here and all of us workers. With 112 kids here our hands are full and we are in immediate need of more workers. <u>Please pray</u> for the Lord to bring more godly, committed workers who will stay on board for the long haul.

<u>Please continue praying</u> also for the Lord's direction and provision as we search for more land. All of the rooms here (including the new rooms) are occupied and we only have space for another 10 kids. We've been doing more looking around for land and currently we're looking at a 1.5 hectare farm lot that's only five minutes away from our location and the owner is willing to sell it for 1,100 pesos per square meter (which is now the cheapest around). We're not quite sure yet if this will be our next target (as we still have a couple of other prospects to check out), but it's starting to look that way and we should be making an announcement sometime within November. We've also received some more donations for the land fund this month and currently we have a little bit over 2.7 million pesos saved up, praise God!

We would like to share an inspiring story about one of the youngsters we took in a couple of months ago after she was found begging on the streets. She's super happy now and doing great here and, for the first time in her life, she's in school and doesn't have to resort to begging to eat. We often ask the kids what they want to do when they grow up so that they will start thinking about their future adult life. We asked this little one and she replied that she wants to be a teacher. We went on to ask her what grade level she wants to teach (assuming she would say elementary or high school, as most would), but we were surprised when she selflessly said that she wants to teach kids who are begging on the streets and don't go to school. What a great example of Christ-like love which always seeks the best for others without expecting anything in return! <u>Please pray</u> for all of the kids to genuinely receive Christ and follow Him.

<u>Please continue praying</u> also for more regular orphanage supporters. We're so thankful for all you supporters and we continually pray for the Lord to bless and protect each of you in an incredible way!
